INCIDENT DETAILS <p>The Pennsylvania State Police wants to make the public aware of important information for the upcoming Luke Bryan concert to be held in Smithton, PA (South Huntington Township), Westmoreland County on September 28, 2024:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Heavy traffic in and around the concert area, to include Interstate 70 and State Route 51 is expected on the day of the event. Please plan accordingly and avoid these areas unless absolutely necessary. 2. Several local roads will be closed due to this event. These roads will be open to local residents only: <ol style="list-style-type: none"> a. Fitz Henry Road will be closed from the concert site to Skyline Drive. Skyline Drive will then be closed from its intersection with Fitz Henry road all the way to SR 981 in Smithton Borough. b. Sherbondy Road will be closed at its intersection with Motordrome Road. In addition, Painter-Koser Road will also be closed. 3. All traffic will be expected to arrive via I-70 and exiting at the Smithton exit. 4. Parking Lots open at 2 PM. No vehicles will be permitted in the parking area until this time. Also, vehicles will not be permitted to stop and wait on Fitz Henry Road before the lots open. 5. As parking will be limited, every person entering the parking lot must show proof of a valid concert ticket. 6. Prohibited items: firearms or weapons of any kind, coolers, backpacks, outside food or drink, glass containers, animals other than service animals, video cameras, large umbrellas, footballs, frisbees, ATVs/UTVs, golf carts
